EUCAnet started in 2004 as a joint initiative of ECSA-C (European Community Studies Association - Canada) and the University of Victoria co-financed by a grant from the European Commission (DG RELEX). 2008-2016 EUCAnet was part of the Strategic Knowledge Cluster Canada-Europe Transatlantic Dialogue, co-financed by the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada (SSHRC) and the University of Victoria. Since 2016, EUCAnet operates with the support of the Erasmus+ Programme of the European Union, the Centre for Global Studies (CFGs), the University of Victoria (UVic) and the European Studies Community Association in Canada (ECSA-C).
