



The Erasmus+ Programme of the European Union awarded a grant to the European Community Studies Association in Canada (ECSA-C) for the project "Building capacity for Canada's European Studies community: the European Community Studies Association Canada (ECSA-C) as a research and outreach hub (ECSA-Cn)".

The main goal of this project is to enhance the networking capacity of the European studies community in Canada. In this respect, ECSA-Cn will provide public visibility to the EU as a key economic and political partner of Canada and thus allow ECSA-C to play a more effective role in promoting research, teaching and outreach initiatives in the field of EU and European Studies.
